ITINERARY

Day 1: Bangkok Arrival (Dinner)

On arrival into Bangkok Suvarnabhumi Airport (BKK) you will be met by a local guide and transferred to **The Theatre Residence**, formerly Bangkok Theatre and reformed to low-rise hotels building by famous actress with story and showcase decoration

Welcome dinner at the hotel

Day 2: Bangkok Highlight Full Day Tour (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)



After breakfast, tour Bangkok's finest attractions and journey around the city's fascinating canal network. Start at the magnificent Grand Palace to take in the beauty of this sprawling temple complex boasting some of the finest Thai-Buddhist architecture in the entire country. Explore the vast grounds and numerous dazzling buildings, including the highly revered **Wat Phra Kaew**,

home to the prized Emerald Buddha statue dating back to the 14th Century. Afterwards, head across the road to **Wat Pho**, one of the largest and oldest temples in Bangkok home to more than 1,000 Buddha images. The temple is considered as the first public university in the Kingdom and the birthplace of traditional Thai massage housing one of the oldest massage schools in the country. After grabbing lunch at a local restaurant, in the afternoon a visit to **Museum Siam** reveals several exhibits displaying the national identity and history of Thai people and their relationships with neighbouring cultures. The concept of the museum is 'Play + Learn = Joyously', achieved through a series of interactive exhibits. Next, hop on a traditional longtail boat to meander through the quaint canals taking in the quieter side of Bangkok life, which would not be complete without an exploration of the spectacular and iconic **Wat Arun**. Take time to explore the iconic temple towering 79 metres over the Chao Phraya River offering panorama across Bangkok from the Thonburi side. Dinner at local restaurant before head back to the hotel.





Day 3: Ayutthaya Highlight Full Day Tour (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)



Today, leave the hotel early morning to discover the historical highlights of Ayutthaya on road and boat to the ancient capital of Thailand. Your first reach

Bang Pa-In Palace, boasting a mix of European, gothic and Thai-Buddhist architecture. There's time to explore the vast grounds that include several temple complexes, a watch tower and a tranquil lake. Hop back into the bus and take a short trip to Wat Yai Chai Mongkol on the eastern banks of the Pa Sak River, a temple said to have been built by King U-Thong as the place for monks returning from Sri Lanka to rest their heads. Next up is Wat Phra Sri Sanphet, a temple that forbids monks to enter (due to its 'royal' status), and then on to Wat Mahathat, a highly-sacred temple famous for its Lord Buddha relics and traditional style once used as a model for other temples in the ancient kingdom. What seems to be the most prominent landmark of the temple is the head of a sandstone Buddha image entwined in the roots of a Bodhi tree. Enjoy an inclusive lunch in a riverside restaurant and learning famous dessert of the city 'Saimai' and taste it before more cultural action in the afternoon by cruising along the river to see the ruins, imagine once it was the charming and glory city in the past. Take the road trip back to Bangkok, reaching your hotel around the lateafternoon.



Day 4: Bangkok Departure (Breakfast)

After breakfast, it is free and easy until time for transfer to Bangkok International Airport for your flight departure to Singapore. You can walk out to explore around hotel where is surrounded with popular local market 'Wang Lang' to discover delicious street food and dessert, or the local fashion selling at cheap prices.
