Hanoi (3 Nights)

ITINERARY

Day 1: Hanoi Arrival (Dinner)

Upon arrival, welcome by our guide and driver, transfer to your hotel. Free and easy until time for transfer for dinner.

In the evening, watch a performance in Hanoi's famous Thang Long theatre, located alongside Hoan Kiem Lake, the Water Puppet show is one steeped in history and culture. The puppetry is accompanied by traditional Vietnamese music performed by a live orchestra and combines both traditional and modern influences to create a unique and priceless cultural experience for visitors to Vietnam. After the show, we take to dinner in a Hanoi local restaurant.

Day 2: Hanoi (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)



After breakfast, proceed to the Temple of Literature, the oldest university in Hanoi and a perfect example of ancient architecture built in homage to the Chinese scholar Confucius. Then, you will drive to the colourful Museum of Ethnology. A good way to have an overview about the 54 ethnic minorities in Vietnam.

Have a unique lunch in KOTO restaurant. KOTO is an organisation which gives disadvantaged youth in the community opportunities to learn new skills in the culinary world.

In the afternoon, drive out of the capital to Bat Trang Village, and see first-hand the ancient art of ceramics that are produced in the village. Here, you will visit a ceramic workshop to see the creation process and learn about the many families in the village that have been producing ceramic art for nearly 400 years.

In the evening, go on a culinary whirlwind this evening, sinking your teeth into the flavours of the North on a street food tour through the alleys of the Old Quarter. Meet your guide at your hotel, before strolling along to the local night market. Watch the bustle and array of goods on display, before setting off into the maze of alleys. Here, stop at a famous pho stall to slurp up this world-renowned beef noodle soup, before grabbing a stool at the neighbouring Bia Hoi Corner. Watch the commotion of this spot as it comes to life in the dark, while sipping a tall glass of cold local draft beer. Continue wandering and take in the sights of various curb side businesses that only open at night. Try some delicacies such as savoury steamed rice rolls with woodear mushroom and pork, a classic Vietnamese sandwich, freshly grilled chicken wings or other snacks that make your stomach rumble! See first-hand the city's obsession with barbecues before finishing things off with some dessert. Take a bite of fresh tropical fruits over shaved ice, drizzled with condensed milk as a perfect way to finish off this street food tour.

Day 3: Hanoi – Sapa (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)



In early morning, transfer north to Sapa town arriving at about 1pm.

Have lunch in local restaurant with typical mountainous specialties.

In the afternoon, travel by car about 30 minutes out of Sapa through the spectacular mountain scenery of Hoang Lien National Park to reach the Silver Waterfall. When the water level is at its peak from May to October, the falls cascade in long silver ribbons over 100m to a series of pools below. You can access the falls through a series of walkways and ladders to get that perfect photo!

Then, you will go through quiet valleys and gorges surrounding the village of O Quy Ho. The shallow winding valley sits in the shadow of Indochina's highest peak, Fansipan Mountain, and on clear days you can enjoy superb views of the range. Away from the major tourist routes, this trek is the perfect escape. Pass by oolong tea farms before joining a local footpath that clings to the contours of the rice terraces and takes you gently down the valley past grazing buffalo and working farmers. Walk along ancient stone paths and hear the story of the Black H'Mong migration to these mountains' centuries before. Learn about the distinct cultures, languages and lifestyles that make north western Vietnam so fascinating, and visit an authentic Black H'Mong house, home to a local family.

Transfer back to Sapa town at end of the day with the famous mountain hot pot to recover from you trek. Dinner with hotpot.

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Day 4: Sapa - Hanoi (Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner)

After breakfast, you will have a short stop to famous Sapa market: a crossroad for ethnic minorities to sell their local products and vegetables. Then, departure for the legendery Fansipan Mount, the roof of Indochina. With its 3.140m, it dominates all valleys & nearby ethnic villages of the region. You will reach the summit by cable car.

A final lunch in Sapa before departure for Hanoi.

Farewell dinner with an iconic dish of Hanoi: Cha Ca (a savoury tasty fish with dill) in a specialized restaurant.

Day 5: Hanoi Airport (B)

Breakfast in hotel. Free and easy until time for transfer to Hanoi Noi Bai International Airport to Singapore.
